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## Introduction

### Why Study at Texas State University?

Texas State University is an International-student friendly institution. ## Introduction

### Who is an International Student?

Nonimmigrant international students on temporary visas enrolled in a U.S. academic program of study. Common nonimmigrant statuses are A-1, A-2, B-1, B-2, E-1, E-2, F-1, F-2, H-1, H-4, J-1, J-2, L-1, L-2, M-1, R-1 R-2, TN, and TD. F-1 is the most common status used by international students. A student who has applied for or received permanent residency, refugee status or asylum in the U.S. is not considered to be an international student at Texas State University.

### Your Second Home - Texas State University

Texas State's original mission was to prepare Texas public school teachers, especially those of the south-central area. It became renowned for carrying out this mission, but today it does far more. The University College also oversees the undergraduate general education core curriculum and undergraduate advising as well as the freshman year experience. The Graduate College provides opportunities for continued intellectual growth through advanced and specialized education that develops leaders in the professions and in research.

The Texas State University Round Rock Campus is located north of Austin. Students there can take upper-level courses leading to bachelor's degrees and complete master's degree and certificate programs. Texas State's San Marcos campus is located in a growing community of over 63,500 people. Located in the Texas Hill Country, where blackland prairies roll into beautiful hills, Texas State enjoys a setting that is unique among Texas universities.

Authorized by the Texas Legislature in 1899, Southwest Texas State Normal School opened its doors in 1903. Over the years, the Legislature broadened the institution's scope and changed its name, in succession, to Normal College, Teachers College, College, and in 1969, University. Each name change reflects the university's growth from a small teacher preparation institution to a major multipurpose university. In 2003, the Legislature renamed the school Texas State University-San Marcos. In 2013 the designation of "San Marcos" was dropped, and the school is now simply called: Texas State University.

Authorized by the Texas Legislature in 1899, Southwest Texas State Normal School opened its doors in 1903. Over the years, the Legislature broadened the institution's scope and changed its name, in succession, to Southwest Texas State Normal College, Southwest Texas State Teachers College, Southwest Texas State College, Southwest Texas State University, and in 2003 to Texas State University. Each name reflects the university's growth from a small teacher preparation institution to a major, multipurpose university. Texas State's original mission was to prepare Texas public school teachers. It became renowned for carrying out this mission, but today it does far more.

As the university's student population has grown — from 303 in 1903 to 37,812 in fall 2020 (33,193 undergraduate; 461 post-baccalaureate; 3,620 master's; 538 doctoral) — our San Marcos campus also has expanded. Today, the campus has grown to 507 acres At the San Marcos Campus and 101 acres at the Round Rock Campus. Texas State has an additional 4,000 acres of academic, agricultural, research, and recreational areas.

The campus is as diverse as the students who live and learn here. In Fall 2020, Texas State University had 57% minority enrollment. Our hilly grounds are home to 219 buildings. Some, like Old Main, are as old as the university itself. Others, such as Bruce and Gloria Ingram Hall on the San Marcos Campus and Willow Hall on the Round Rock Campus, opened in 2018.

\*In Summer 2020, the Texas State Intensive English Program was closed and no longer admitted hosted students for language training beginning Fall 2020.

In Fall 2020, 602 international students applied to Texas State and 253 students (42%), were admitted. Out of 253 students admitted, 86 students (34%) were enrolled in courses on the day after the census date (12<sup>th</sup> class day).

In Fall 2020, Texas State University hosted **86 new international students** and 407 continuing international students for a total international student population of 493 students from 72 countries. The percentage comparison to the total student population is as follows:

- **1.30%**, 493 out of 37,812 total students were international students.
- **7.19%**, 332 out of 4,619 total graduate students were international students.
- **0.49%**, 161 out of 33,193 total undergraduate students were international students.





### Applications by Region: Fall 2018 – 2020




**Applications by Region: Fall 2020**














### Fall 2020 Graduate Students by Region










### Undergraduate Students by Region Fall 2020










**All Students Enrollment by Region Fall 2020**




### Enrollment by Country Trend: Top 10 Countries Fall 2018 – 2020


### Enrollment by Country Trend: India (#1) Fall 2018 – 2020








