What Is My Role?

- Satisfy the legal requirements of Chapter 49 of the Code of Criminal Procedures
 - Conduct an inquest
 - Maintain custody of the human remains in order to determine identity, make notification to family and authorities, determine cause and manner of death, issue a death certificate, and coordinate release of remains to the next of kin.
- Assist in developing local solutions for remains recovery, transportation and storage, morgue operations, identification, and remains release for final disposition
- Participate in the planning effort

How Do I Get Started?

- Contact your local or county Emergency Management Coordinator.
- Contact your local health department. If you are in a county without a local health department, contact the preparedness manager in your Health Service Region.
- If mass fatality planning is not taking place, advocate for mass fatality planning in your region or county
