

We have reserved a place for you at New Student Orientation (NSO). This booklet will let you know what you can expect to do and learn there.



NSO FAQS

DO I HAVE TO COMPLETE NSO?

Everyone who is admitted to Texas State is required to complete New Student Orientation.

WHY IS NSO REQUIRED?

Research indicates that students who complete orientation have higher rates of success in college than those who don't. NSO gives you everything you need to start off right at Texas State. You'll meet your academic advisor, register for classes, connect with campus resources and traditions, meet new and current students — and have fun, too!

HOW DO I CHANGE MY NSO SESSION?

You may change your registration from one session to another without financial penalty if space is available. To change your session, visit the NSO homepage at **admissions.txstate.edu/nso**, where you will find the registration link. Please note the orientation fee is nonrefundable.

Planning to bring a family member or guest to NSO?

Make sure to register ahead of time by logging in to your New Student Orientation account at admissions.txstate.edu/nso.

WHERE DO I PARK?

Parking is available in the Matthews Street Parking Garage. Texas State requires that all vehicles on campus have a valid Texas State Parking Permit. Please bring the one in this booklet or ask for one from an Orientation Staff member when you arrive on campus.

WILL MY FAMILY MEMBERS BE WITH ME FOR ADVISING AND CLASS REGISTRATION?

Due to space and privacy limitations family and guests will **not** be allowed in the advising appointment and registration lab. Make sure to write down all the questions your family might have prior to your advising appointment.

SCHEDULE

1-DAY ORIENTATION

If you are eligible to attend a single-day NSO session, you will spend the morning attending some important information sessions to support your college success and have an opportunity to learn more about Texas State campus life and culture.

After lunch you will meet with your academic advisor, register for classes and learn more about specific programs available to support your success.

2-DAY ORIENTATION

All incoming freshmen are required to attend a two-day orientation program. Your first day will be filled with information sessions to help you make a strong start on your college career. You'll also get to experience campus life and spend the night in a residence hall.

On day two, you will meet with your academic advisor, register for classes and learn more about specific programs available to support your success during your first year.

WHERE YOU'LL SLEEP

(FOR STUDENTS ATTENDING 2-DAY NSO SESSIONS)

STUDENT OVERNIGHT ACCOMMODATIONS

Freshmen students are required to stay overnight on campus in a designated Texas State residence hall during NSO. Your overnight accommodations are automatically reserved when you sign up for NSO.

Chautauqua and Gaillardia Hall

302 Student Center Drive

Chautauqua and Gaillardia halls offer double occupancy rooms set up in pod-style fashion, with each pod sharing a common bathroom. Each floor offers study and lounge spaces, while the lobby features comfortable TV viewing areas and other recreational amenities.

Parking

202 Student Center Drive

Parking is available in the Matthews Street Parking Garage. Texas State requires that all vehicles on campus have a valid Texas State Parking Permit. Please bring the one in this booklet or ask for one from an Orientation Staff member when you arrive on campus.

STUDENT CHECK-IN

For our two-day orientation sessions, check-in will start at Chautauqua and Gaillardia halls at 8 a.m.

Room and roommate assignments for NSO will be made at check-in. To request a specific roommate, you and your preferred roommate should check in together. After you check in make your way to the LBJ Student Center. The entrance doors to Chautauqua and Gaillardia halls will lock at 10 a.m. Please make sure you have all of your items you will need out of your room before 10 a.m.

WHAT TO BRING TO STAY OVERNIGHT

You should bring a set of twin sheets, a blanket and pillow, some shower shoes (flip-flops work well), a bath towel, toiletries and an alarm clock. Refer to page 20 for a list of what to bring.

STUDENT CHECKOUT

Be prepared to check out of your residence hall by 7:30 a.m. on day two. You should be finished with registration for fall semester classes by 5 p.m. on day two of NSO.

FAMILY ACCOMMODATIONS

Your family is also welcome to sample campus life by staying overnight in another designated Texas State residence hall.

Overnight accommodations are not included in the NSO guest fee, but can be reserved through the Department of Housing and Residential Life. Go to **reslife.txstate.edu** and click on the Summer Camps and Conferences tab. Family rates are \$35 per person per night payable online or upon arrival at the residence hall.

San Jacinto Hall

217 West Woods

Family accommodations will be in San Jacinto Hall, which is a suite-style hall. Guests will each have their own bedroom and will share a bathroom and common area. A parent or guest staying alone on campus will be assigned to share a four-bedroom suite with other guests of the same gender. Couples will be assigned one half of a suite, which contains two private bedrooms and a bathroom. The living area may be shared with another couple. Each floor offers a lounge with a TV, while the lobby features a TV and other recreational amenities.

FAMILY CHECK-IN

Check-in for families staying overnight will start at 8 a.m. in San Jacinto Hall and will continue through 10 a.m. Please note that San Jacinto Hall is located in a different area of campus. Please leave your items in your car as your student checks in to their residence hall.

WHAT FAMILIES NEED TO BRING TO STAY OVERNIGHT

Each family member staying overnight on campus should bring a set of twin sheets, a blanket and pillow, some shower shoes (flip-flops work well), a bath towel, toiletries and an alarm clock. Refer to page 20 for a list of what to bring.

FAMILY AND GUEST CHECKOUT

Be prepared to check out of your residence hall by 7:30 a.m. on day two. Your student should be finished with registration for fall semester classes by 5 p.m. on day two of NSO.

TEST INFORMATION

TEXAS SUCCESS INITIATIVE (TSI) PROGRAM

The state-legislated Texas Success Initiative Program seeks to improve student success in college-level course work by assessing incoming students' math, reading and writing proficiency. The program provides guidance for developmental course work to those needing to strengthen basic academic skills.

Students with certain SAT, ACT or STAAR scores may be exempt from assessment testing. Students who are not exempt will need to take one or more sections of the TSI Assessment. The TSI Assessment is offered at testing centers located on community college and university campuses across the state. Failure to satisfy TSI requirements may affect a student's class registration process.

Prior to taking the TSI Assessment, you will take a pre-assessment activity (PAA). Instructions to complete the PAA will be provided by the testing center. This online activity is designed to help students understand the importance and purpose of the assessment, developmental course options and institutional resources.

Students whose TSI Assessment scores do not meet the minimum requirements for exemption have two options:

- 1. Retake the TSI Assessment and attempt to meet the minimum required scores.
- Register for and successfully pass the appropriate math, reading and/ or writing developmental courses. Developmental courses do not count toward a degree plan but are designed to prepare students academically for college-level course work.

IB, AP AND CLEP INFORMATION

Texas State will accept some examinations in the International Baccalaureate (IB) and Advanced Placement (AP) programs as credit for college courses. You may also participate in the College-Level Examination Program (CLEP) to earn credit for some courses. To learn more about these opportunities, visit txstate.edu/temc.



ESSENTIALS

CHECK YOUR HOLDS

Visit **ssb.txstate.edu** to see a listing of the holds on your account. Holds are items that you have not completed and will need to get done in order to register. All students will have an Orientation hold and Advising hold; those will be removed at orientation. Work to have all other holds removed prior to your orientation date for ease of registration.

MENINGITIS VACCINATION

State law requires that all students under 22 years of age entering any institution of higher education in Texas provide proof of immunization for bacterial meningitis. We strongly recommend you address this hold before arriving at NSO, since you will not be able to register for classes until this requirement is met. Step-by-step instructions on how to upload your documents, information about exemptions and where to get the meningitis vaccination can be found on our Meningitis Vaccination Requirement webpage, at admissions.txstate.edu/meningitis.

HOUSING CONTRACT/EXEMPTION

New freshmen under the age of 20 by September 1 for fall admission or January 1 for spring admission with fewer than 30 credit hours are required to live in on-campus university housing. All students who graduated from high school within the preceding 12 months of the semester of their admission are also required to live on campus. If you have not yet completed your housing contract or filed for an exemption with the Department of Housing and Residential Life, you should do so right away. You will not be able to register for classes during NSO if the department does not have your contract or approved exemption on file.

TEXAS TOMORROW FUND

If you will use your Texas Tomorrow Fund to pay tuition and fees, please provide a signed copy of your Texas Tomorrow Fund ID card along with your Texas State ID number to the Texas State Student Business Services Office before arriving for NSO. TEXAS TUITION PROMISE FUND

The **purchaser** of the Texas Tuition Promise Fund must contact Texas Tuition Promise Fund each semester that they want to authorize redemption of eligible Tuition Units and required fees. Texas Tuition Promise Fund will contact the university of the student's eligibility, upon approval. Please allow sufficient time for Texas Tuition Promise Fund to receive and approve your request prior to the due date.

STUDENTS AND GUESTS WITH DISABILITIES

If you or your parents need special assistance (e.g., sign language interpreting services, information in an alternative format, etc.) or other arrangements during NSO due to a disability, contact the Office of Disability Services at ods@txstate.edu or 512.245.3451 at least one week prior to your assigned NSO session. Information regarding campus accessibility is available at maps.txstate.edu. Click on the link for each building to see accessibility information. Please note that the university does not provide wheelchairs.

AFTER NSO

WHAT HAPPENS AFTER NSO?

You'll leave NSO with your class schedule in hand. When you return to campus the week before classes begin, we'll help you settle in with Bobcat Preview, which gives new students the information they need right before classes start. Texas State traditions like Convocation, Common Experience and University Seminar will help you become part of campus life right away. BOBCAT PREVIEW

Your next step is Bobcat Preview, a transition program that begins on Monday, August 19, and ends Saturday, August 24.

Bobcat Preview is required for all new freshmen and those who have transferred fewer than 30 credits from another college campus. If you have 30 or more college credits transferring to Texas State, you will still need to attend Bobcat Preview if it has been less than a year since your high school graduation. Throughout this week, there are a number of required programs to attend as well as entertainment events and free time for you to explore your new home. This is important in preparing you for success at Texas State!
