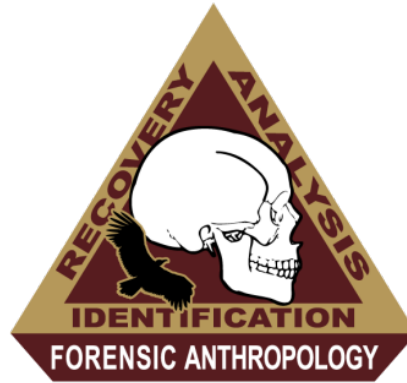

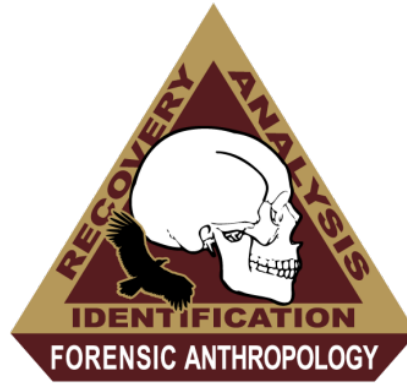

HB 1419

A justice of the peace investigating a death described by Subsection

<u>(e) A justice of the peace investigating a death described</u>	
	<u>by Subsection (a)(3)(B), or the justice's designee, shall, not</u>
	<u>later than the 10th working day after the date that one or more</u>
	<u>identifying features of the unidentified body are determined or the</u>
	<u>60th day after the date the investigation began, whichever is</u>
	<u>earlier, enter all available identifying features of the</u>
	<u>unidentified body (fingerprints, dental records, any unusual</u>
	<u>physical characteristics, and a description of the clothing found</u>
	<u>on the body) into the National Missing and Unidentified Persons</u>
	<u>System.</u>
