#### **SUFFIXES**

**Introduction:** Suffixes are syllables added to the ends of words to change their functions. For example, add the suffix <u>-ful</u> to <u>wonder</u> (a noun); the new word is the adjective, <u>wonderful</u>. Other examples:

angel (noun) + ic	becomes	angelic (adjective)
friend (noun) + ship	becomes	friendship (noun)
sterile (adjective) + ize	becomes	sterilize (verb)
soft (adjective) + ly	becomes	softly (adverb)
