Who is an International Student?

Nonimmigrant international students on temporary visas enrolled in a U.S. academic program of study. Common nonimmigrant statuses are A-1, A-2, B-1, B-2, E-1, E-2, F-1, F-2, H-1, H-4, J-1, J-2, L-1, L-2, M-1, R-1 R-2, TN, and TD. F-1 is the most common status used by international students. A student who has applied for or received permanent residency, refugee status, or asylum in the U.S. is not considered to be an international student at Texas State University.

Your Second Home - Texas State University

Texas State's original mission was to prepare Texas public school teachers, especially those of the south-central area. It became renowned for carrying out this mission, but today it does far more. The University College also oversees the undergraduate general education core curriculum and undergraduate advising as well as the freshman year experience. The Graduate College provides opportunities for continued intellectual growth through advanced and specialized education that develops leaders in the professions and in research.

Texas State students come from around the globe, and our student body is diverse. Fifty-four percent of Texas State students are ethnic minorities. See the <u>Facts and Data page</u> for more information on our student body.

The Texas State University Round Rock Campus is located north of Austin. Students there can take upper-level courses leading to bachelor's degrees and complete master's degrees and certificate programs. Students who complete their degree requirements at the Round Rock Campus earn their degrees from Texas State University.

Location

Texas State's San Marcos campus is located in a growing community of over 63,500 people. Located in the Texas Hill Country, where blackland prairies roll into beautiful hills, Texas State enjoys a setting that is unique among Texas universities.

The beauty of the crystal-clear <u>San Marcos River</u> and the stately cypress, oak, and pecan trees on the campus add to the charm of the university's picturesque setting. Our location on the banks of the San Marcos River provides recreational activities for students throughout the year.





Authorized by the Texas Legislature in 1899, Southwest Texas State Normal School opened its doors in 1903. Over the years, the Legislature broadened the institution's scope and changed its name, in succession, to Normal College, Teachers College, College, and in 1969, University. Each name change reflects the university's growth from a small teacher preparation institution to a major multipurpose university. In 2003, the Legislature renamed the school Texas State University-San Marcos. In 2013 the designation of "San Marcos" was dropped, and the school is now simply called: Texas State University.

Authorized by the Texas Legislature in 1899, Southwest Texas State Normal School opened its doors in 1903. Over the years, the Legislature broadened the institution's scope and changed its name, in succession, to Southwest Texas State Normal College, Southwest Texas State Teachers College, Southwest Texas State College, Southwest Texas State University, and in 2003 to Texas State University. Each name reflects the university's growth from a small teacher preparation institution to a major, multipurpose university. Texas State's original mission was to prepare Texas public school teachers. It became renowned for carrying out this mission, but today it does far more.

Colleges

The University offers courses in <u>Applied Arts</u>, <u>McCoy College of Business Administration</u>, <u>Education</u>, <u>Fine Arts and Communication</u>, <u>Health Professions</u>, <u>Liberal Arts</u>, <u>Science and Engineering</u>, <u>University College</u> and The <u>Graduate College</u>. As an Emerging Research University, Texas State offers opportunities for discovery and innovation to faculty and students. In 1986 the University College was created to assure a broad general education for all students, regardless of major. In 1935 the Board of Regents authorized the formation of The Graduate College.

As the university's student population has grown — from 303 in 1903 to 37,864 in fall 2021 (33,175 undergraduate; 444 post-baccalaureate; 3,662 master's; 583 doctoral). Today, the university has grown to over 500 acres at the San Marcos Campus and over 100 acres at the Round Rock Campus. Texas State has about 4,000 additional acres of academic, agricultural, research, and recreational areas.

The campus is as diverse as the students who live and learn here. In Fall 2021, 55% of Texas State students are minorities. Our hilly grounds are home to over 200 buildings. Some, like Old Main, are as old as the university itself. Others, such as Bruce and Gloria Ingram Hall on the San Marcos Campus and Willow Hall on the Round Rock Campus, opened in 2018.

In Fall 2021, 868 international students applied to Texas State and 464 students (53%), were admitted. Out of 464 students admitted, 217 students (47%) were enrolled in courses on the day after census date (12th class day). The applied to enrolled rate is 25%.

In Fall 2021, Texas State University hosted <u>217 new international students</u> and 348 continuing international students for a total international student population of 566 internationals students from 72 countries. The percentage comparison to the total student population is as follows:

- 1.49%, 566 out of 37,868 total students were international students.
- **8.37%**, 390 out of 4,662 total graduate students were international students.
- 0.53%, 176 out of 33,175 total undergraduate students were international students.

OPT is 12 months of temporary, full-time work authorization granted by DHS. All F-1 students may qualify for OPT. Students who have completed OPT and have a qualifying STEM designated degree are eligible for 2 additional years of work through STEM-OPT. OPT students include those with STEM degrees.

In Fall 2021, 219 students were either seeking or participating in practical training.





Applications by Region: Fall 2019 – 2021




2019 – 2021 Application Trends by Region


Applications by Region: Fall 2021










Enrollment Trends 2002 – 2021






Fall 2021 Graduate Students by Region



Fall 2020 Graduate Students by Region









Graduate Enrollment by Academic College




Graduate Students by Academic College Fall 2020






Undergraduate Students by Region Fall 2021



Undergraduate Students by Region Fall 2020




Undergraduate Students by Region Fall 2019










All Students Enrollment by Region Fall 2021




Enrollment by Country – All Students

Enrollment by Country Trend: India (#1) Fall 2019 – 2021



Undergraduate Students by Classification Fall 2021




Graduate Students by Classification Fall 2021


